# A short guide to surviving a few days in Otley, England

A Day with an English Family:

- British people usually get up around 7am.
- We have a breakfast usually consisting of cereal or toast through the weekdays, some people eat porridge as the weather turns colder.
- Families often have a full English breakfast at weekends, this may consist of fried or grilled, sausages, bacon, fried eggs and sometimes black pudding.



- On Sundays, a traditional family has a Sunday lunch, this may consist of roast meat with potatoes and vegetables. A local speciality is "Yorkshire Pudding", which is not actually sweet, it was served as a first course to a roast Sunday lunch to fill you up.
- We have lots of traditional Yorkshire dishes which you may get the chance to try. We love fish and chips, and this is served with mushy peas, salt and vinegar.
- Afternoon tea used to be taken during the afternoon and would typically consist of scones, sandwiches, cakes and tea. We don't have this so often nowadays as most people are at work, we do however still like to treat ourselves on special occasions.



- English people usually remove their outdoor shoes inside the home and wear slippers.
- We usually have dinner between 5-7pm.
- It is considered polite to ask "please may I leave the table" before leaving the dinner table.
- It is good manners to wait until everybody is seated at the dining table before starting to eat your meal.
- Evening activities consist of watching TV, homework and meeting friends.

#### Otley

- Although Otley is near Leeds its still quite a rural community, which is surrounded by rolling English countryside.
- We British are often very preoccupied about the weather because it often rains, because of this we benefit from our surrounding lush green fields and trees.



- Otley is a typical Yorkshire market town where animals from the surrounding farms would have been traded. We still have a cattle market and a weekly market which sells local produce and clothes.
- Otley is situated in the north of England, in the county of North Yorkshire, about 20 minutes drive from Leeds. We have a large river flowing through Otley called the River Wharfe.



• Otley is famous for Thomas Chippindale (a famous furniture maker who lived here), in the recent Olympics one of our ex-students won a silver medal in the road race.



#### English Family Homes

- A typical family live in a 3 bedroom semi-detached home, with a small garden and one bathroom. A family usually owns between 1 and 3 cars.
- Many local houses are terraced, which means they are a long row of houses which are joined together.



#### The Life of a English Student

- Every child in England is required to attend school as compulsory education until the age of 16 years.
- A school day begins at 8:30am till 3pm with 5 x 1 hour lessons. We have a 20 minute break in the morning and a lunch break for 50 minutes.
- We raise our hands in class to contribute or answer a question, calling our teachers by miss or sir, we would never call them by their first names.
- We cycle, walk, get a bus or our parents drive us to school.
- At the age of 14 years old you begin GCSEs which are qualifications earned by every teenager. It's then optional to earn A-Levels in 6<sup>th</sup> form between the ages of 16 to 18 years old.
- Most students have school dinners, and a few choose to have a packed lunch from home. From the age of 14 years old (year 10) you have the privilege of visiting the local town centre (Otley) to purchase lunch of your choice.
- A lot of students have a part time job, usually on a Saturday.
- In our free time we enjoy visiting Leeds city centre to go shopping or to the cinema.
