Questionnaire was completed by 40 students.

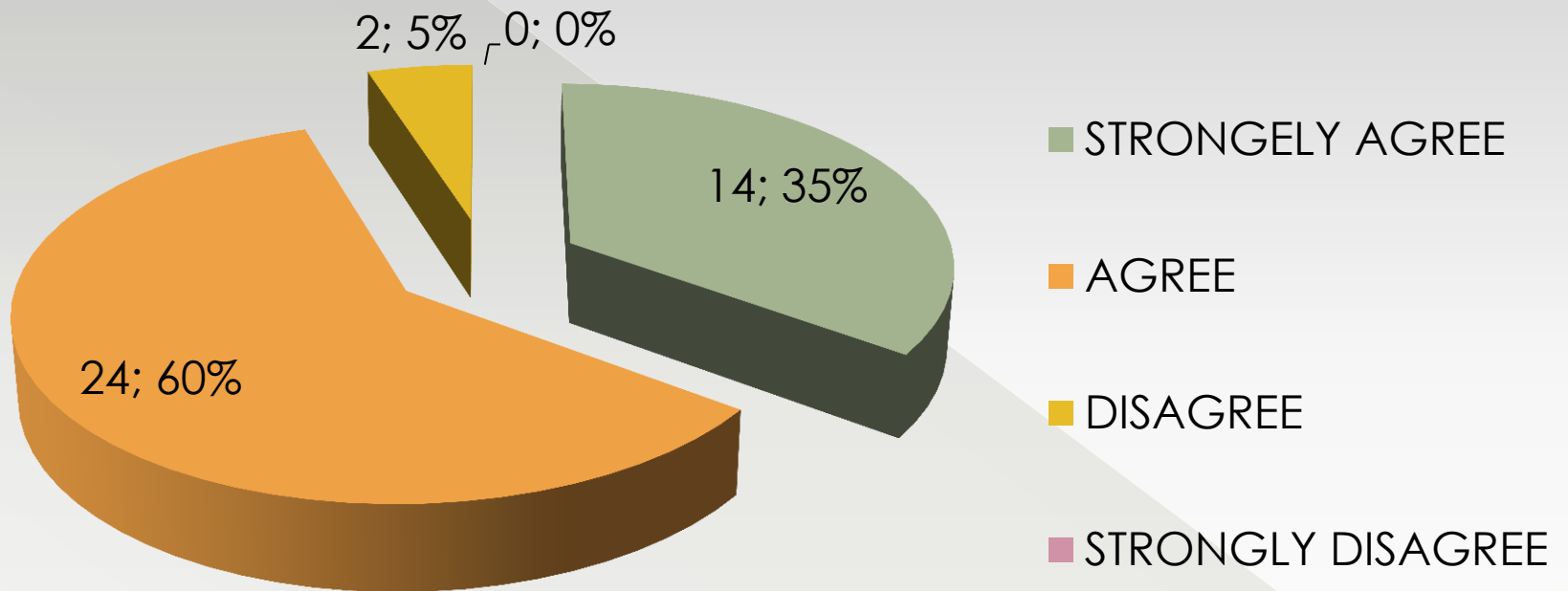


9 Males – 22,50%

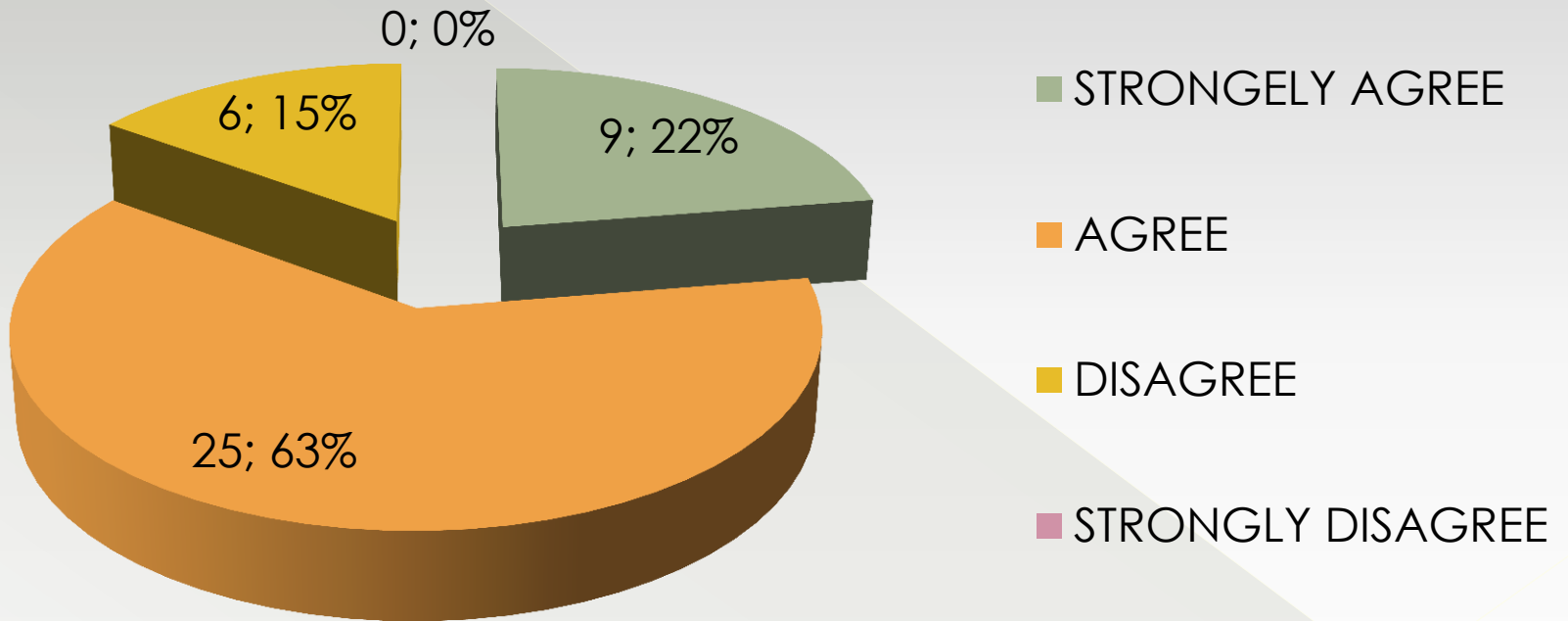


31 Females – 77,50%

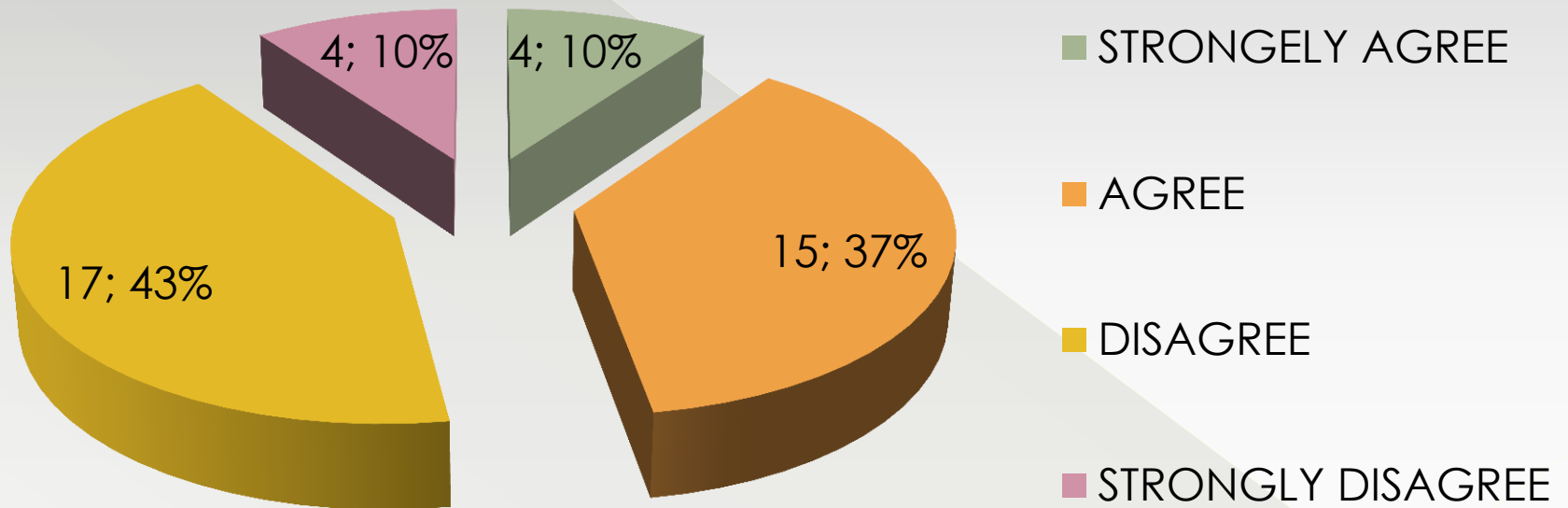
1. Boys and girls have equal opportunities in my school.



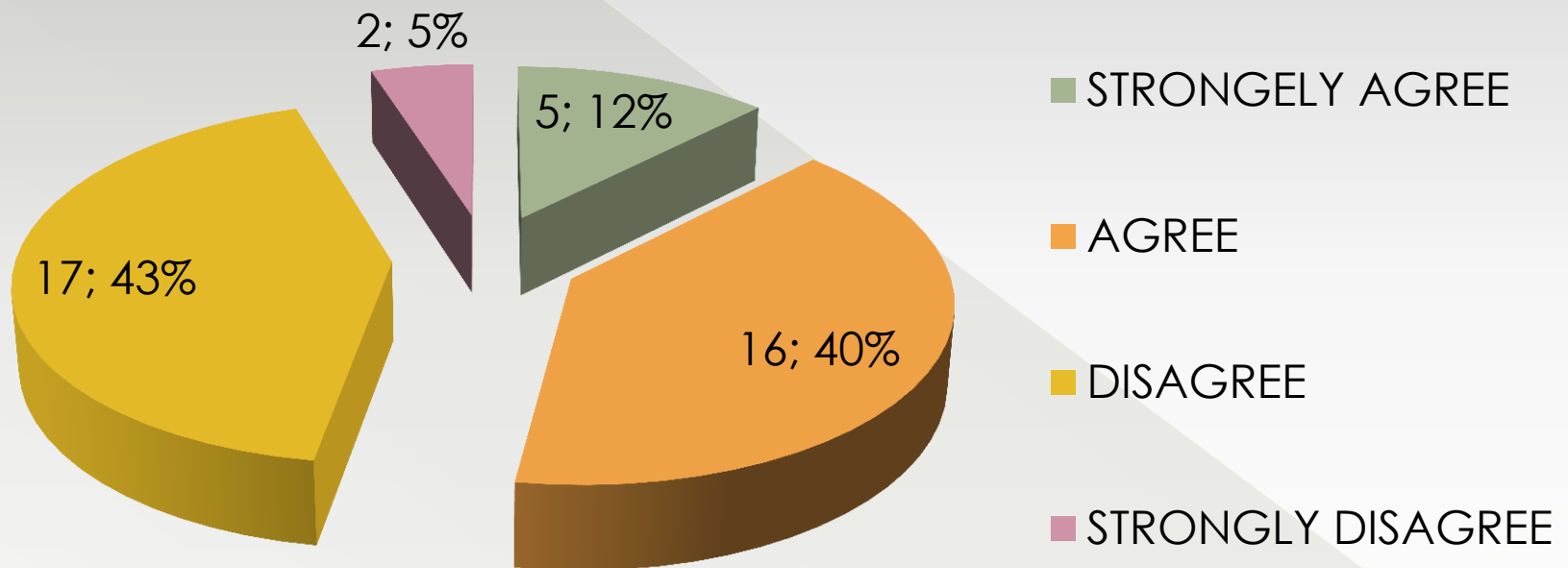
2. Women are as likely as men to occupy leadership roles in schools in my country.



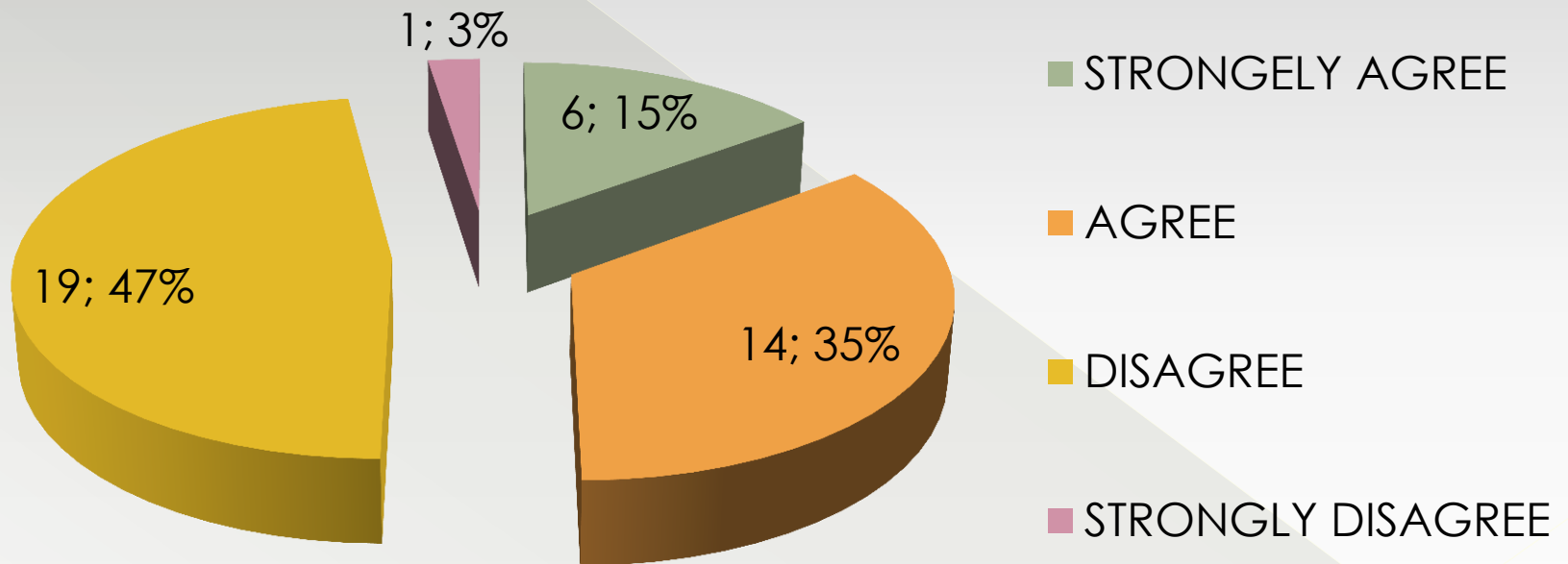
3. Women are as likely as men to occupy leadership roles in businesses in my country.



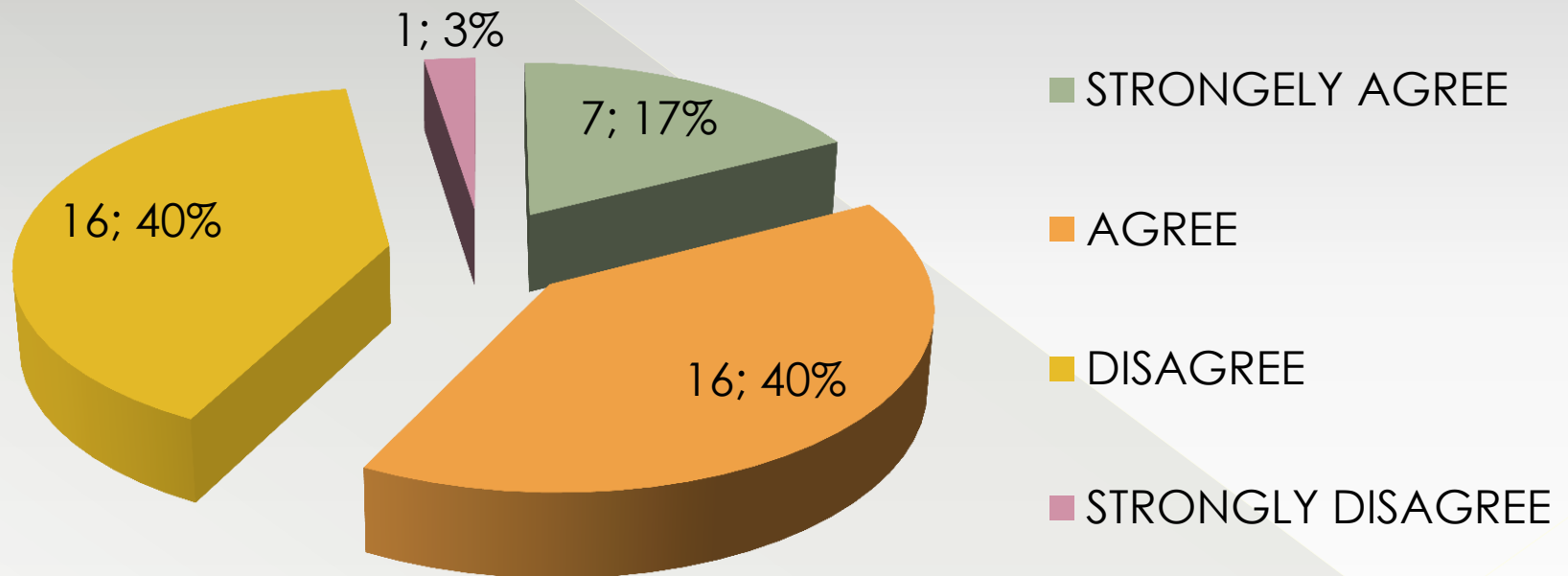
4. Gender stereotypes are rarely reinforced in the media in my country.



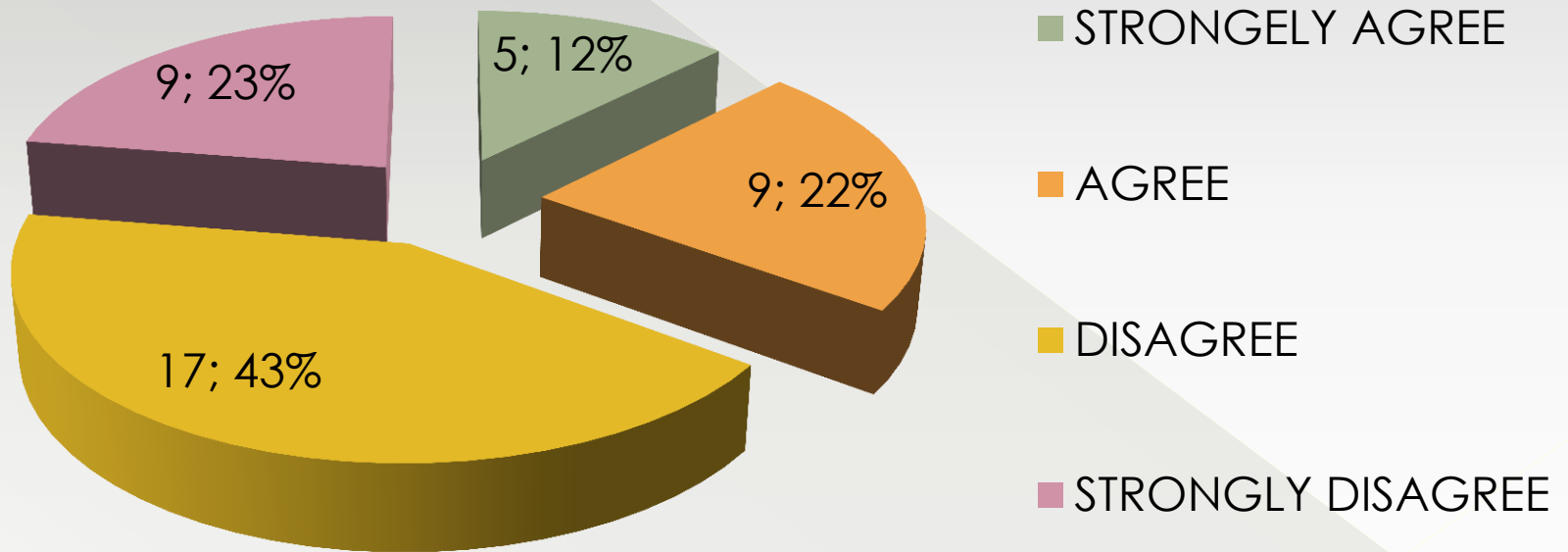

There is bigger pressure for girls than boys to behave in a particular way in our society.

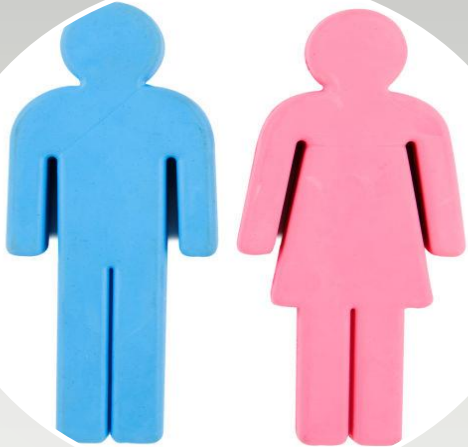
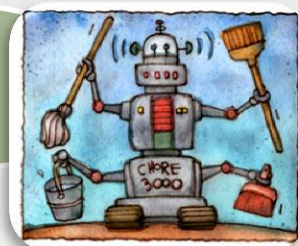


There is more pressure on women than men in terms of physical appearance in our society.
